































## Call for Nominations

### Section on Developmental and Behavioral Pediatrics Executive Committee

The Section on Developmental and Behavioral Pediatrics (SODBP) is seeking nominees for 1 position on the Executive Committee (EC). Nominations for these positions will be accepted until **November 17, 2017** and elections will be held in March 2018. Elected candidates will begin their term on **November 1, 2018**. Successful candidates can serve up to 2 three-year terms. A nominating committee will review all nominees and select the candidates for the ballot. Submission of a nomination does not guarantee inclusion on the ballot.

#### EC Member Requirements:

- Attend all EC meetings (The SODBP has 2 face-to-face meetings per year. Each meeting is usually 1-2 days) plus interim conference call as needed (typically 4 per year).
- Review all relevant material before meetings. Make contributions and voice objective opinions on issues.
- Complete individual assignments in accordance with a timeline/deadline established by the chairperson and/or staff.
- Regularly review and provide feedback on AAP policy statements, clinical reports, technical reports, book chapters, and other materials as well as participate in external document review.
- Contribute to the development of new and/or revised SODBP resources including policy statements, clinical and technical reports.
- Offer innovative ideas and volunteer to take the lead in various activities (including presenting topics at in-person conferences and/or webinars) appropriate to expertise.
- Represent the SODBP in meetings of other sections, committees, councils, or organizations as directed by the SODBP EC and/or Academy leadership.
- Participate in sub-committees or other ad hoc workgroups via conference calls and/or e-mail as needed.
- Contribute and/or review content for the SODBP Web site, Collaboration site, and [healthychildren.org](http://healthychildren.org).
- Respond to media requests, member inquiries and other requests from the general public.
- Be versed in current literature and issues related to the field of child development and behavior.
- Be accessible and responsive to the chairperson, other EC members, and staff via e-mail (primarily) and phone.
- Must be a member in good standing within the Section on Developmental and Behavioral Pediatrics.

- Primary care pediatrician
- Early career physician (ie, 10 years post residency or fellowship training)
- Knowledge or expertise in innovative training/educational strategies
