### **Southwest SIDS Research Institute**

The mission of SW SIDS is to end unexpected infant mortality through education, support, medical services and research.

Unintentional suffocation is the leading cause of injury death among children aged < 1 year in the United States and many of these deaths are linked to unsafe sleep practices. Research has documented a 4 fold increase in accidental suffocation/co-sleeping deaths since the 1980's.



## TPS Foundation 2015 Featured Grantee

### **Texas Drowning Prevention Alliance**

Drowning is the second leading cause of unintentional injury-related death among Texas children. Children ages one to four years old have the highest drowning mortality rates. The Texas Drowning Prevention Alliance is a non-profit organization that hopes to reduce those rates. They provide educational materials and resources to families, pediatricians, and communities to raise awareness on how to prevent drowning and save lives.



Contrary to what most people believe, drowning is a quick and silent killer. The majority of drowning occurs in family pools.

The purpose of the Texas Drowning Prevention Alliance is to join all existing individual and community drowning efforts together under one umbrella to implement effective statewide drowning prevention.

The focus of their prevention efforts is education and legislation. They disseminate information on ways in which we can all take an active part in helping to save at-risk kids from fatal drowning deaths.
